## **First Reading**

from the Acts of Apostles, Chapter 10: verses 34-43

*God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead.*

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household:

“The truth I have now come to realise,’ he said, ‘is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him. It is true, God sent his word to the people of Israel, and it was to them that the good news of peace was brought by Jesus Christ - but Jesus Christ is Lord of all men. You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses -we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.”

This is the word of the Lord.

## **Second Reading**

from the letter of St Paul to the Romans, Chapter 5: verses 17-21

*However great the number of sins committed, grace was even greater.*

If it is certain that death reigned over everyone  
as the consequence of one man's fall,  
it is even more certain that one man, Jesus Christ,  
will cause everyone to reign in life who receives the free gift,  
that he does not deserve, of being made righteous.  
Again, as one man's fall brought condemnation on everyone,  
so the good act of one man brings everyone life and makes them justified.  
As by one man's disobedience many were made sinners,  
so by one man's obedience many will be made righteous.  
When law came, it was to multiply the opportunities of falling,  
but however great the number of sins committed, grace was even greater;  
and so, just as sin reigned wherever there was death,  
so grace will reign to bring eternal life thanks to the righteousness  
that comes through Jesus Christ our Lord.
