I think the only time we saw her ruffled was when on holiday in Italy, when your dad (and all the other men) wanted to buy bee or wine with the few pounds we had left and she wanted to buy cornflakes! Something we all laughed about in later years.

A familiar phrase when a place of food was placed in front of her 'I couldn't possibly eat all of that!' And then proceeded to polish off the whole plate in front of her.

Your mum was such an amazing person, a legend. We honestly had so many laughs. Take me back to those long holidays in the South of France where we ate cheese and crisps and banquets and complained about the UHT milk! We have been so lucky, our parents such good people. Looking back at photos, your mum is always smiling. You, Hilary and your mum and dad are the closest thing I have have after my own family. Take strength in all that she was and all that you are.
